

Official Rules – Ludicious «Student Competition» 2017

The «Student Competition»

The «Student Competition» is held by Ludicious - Zürich Game Festival. By submitting a project, the entrant is at the same time indicating his or her acceptance of these rules. A game can only be submitted to either the «International Competition» or the «Student Competition», but not to both of them.

«Outstanding Talent Award»

For no less than the best game by a student team, the «Outstanding Talent Award» will be handed out to a game that demonstrates a level of creativity and quality that is exceptional among its peers. The prize for winning the «Outstanding Talent Award» is EUR 4'000.

How to enter

Submissions are open until Sunday, October 2nd 2016 (23:59 CET).
In order to be entered, the following must be submitted before the above time:
A completed entry form on the competition's website (competitions.ludicious.ch)
which contains:

- Title
- Short Description
- Details about the game's development
- 3-5 Images and link to a video
- Technical details and instructions
- An upload or link to the build version being entered
- Details about the development team
- Proof of enrollment in education during spring 2016 for relevant team members

Selection process

The festival will narrow down the amount of games to a number of nominees, through a process it deems suitable. Nominees will be notified by mid-December and their games will be presented to a jury, consisting of at least three members with a background in digital games and related fields. The decisions of the jury are final and incontestable.

The award ceremony will take place during the festival in Zurich between January 26 and 29 2017. Any game nominated will be invited to be exhibited at the festival, and the development team will be provided with 2 conference passes and, if needed, accommodation for 2 people in Zurich during the festival.

Release

By taking part, the entrant grants permission to the festival to exhibit the information, game and media entered and to use it in its communication and marketing materials.

Submission requirements

- The game has to be created by students and not professionals.
 - 50% or more of the production team must have been enrolled in school or university during the spring semester of 2016.
- A playable, feature-complete digital game that requires a computer, smartphone, tablet, console or handheld device to run
- If a game can only run on a system (hardware) that is not available to the organizers, the hardware needed will have to be provided by the submitting party
- The game is a creation of its own and does not plagiarize or clone existing games
- The game has not been released before October 4th 2015
 - A release includes availability on any major monetized distribution platform
- The submitting party either:
 - Owns all content and copyrighted materials being submitted
 - Or, has legal permissions to use content by third parties and third-party technologies, as well as software, including the necessary rights for showing and publishing the game

Excluded from the competition are the following:

- Games that were commissioned
- Games that were nominated in any prior Ludicious «Student Competition» or «International Competition»
- Games which present members of any sex or of a social group in a demeaning way, or which are generally offensive to human dignity
- Games which glorify or trivialize violence
- Games which are pornographic in character
- Games, or an associated asset, that contain a significant amount created by professionals

Prize terms

The prize will be awarded in the form of bank transfer. Potential transaction fees and taxes according to Swiss law will be deducted from the amount. The winner is solely responsible for bearing any taxes, social insurances, fees, or other costs relating to the prize.

If the winner is domiciled in Switzerland the prize will only be transferred to a legal entity or a natural person registered as self-employed at a Swiss social insurance

institution. In the latter case, the prize will be transferred after the winner handed in a confirmation about his or her registration as self-employed issued by his social insurance institution.
